



Hospital During Covid-19

- Before surgery
 - Pre-op over the phone
 - Blood tests
 - COVID-19 test
- What was it like being in hospital?
 - Quiet, a lot less people than usual in general
 - Difficult, less freedom to move around
 - Lonely, no visitors
 - My fellow patients
- Hospital stay = 5 days

After Surgery



Recovering First Six Weeks

- Remainder of first six weeks post op
 - Head above shoulders (no bending down)
 - Very reliant
 - First three weeks
 - Hard to read, use computer
 - Sleep 12+ hours
 - External wound pain as well as internal wound pain
 - Housebound until week 6

Recovering Where am I now?

- And now
 - Easy to do too much
 - Still days of extreme tiredness
 - External wound healed
 - Internal wound healing
- Major learning = <u>Don't rush</u>

- Moving into the unknown
- Success of surgery
- Medication
- Further surgery
- Most important = support structure and honesty
