Biographies



Professor Rustam Al-Shahi Salman

Professor of clinical neurology, clinical director of Edinburgh Clinical Trials Unit at The University of Edinburgh

Professor Salman has been CAUK's advisor on neurology for many years. He has authored many of the pivotal papers on cavernoma and has had a long interest in obtaining high-quality evidence for the optimal treatment of cavernoma. This has culminated in the CARE Study, the subject of his discussion with Mr Kitchen at this meeting.



Mr Neil Kitchen

Consultant Neurosurgeon, National Hospital for Neurology and Neurosurgery, Queen Square, London

Mr Kitchen has been CAUK's advisor on neurosurgery for many years. He has long experience of the neurosurgery and stereotactic neurosurgery of cavernoma. He is currently the immediate past President of the Society of British Neurosurgeons, and is the co-chief investigator of the team running the CARE Study.



Mr Bassel Zebian

Consultant Paediatric and Adult Neurosurgeon, King's College Hospital NHS Foundation Trust

Mr Zebian is a consultant neurosurgeon specialised in the management of brain and spine lesions and malformations, including cavernomas, in both adults and children. He is a leader in the field of minimally invasive neurosurgery, with approaches that have allowed access to previously inaccessible lesions and their removal.



Dr Lina Nashef

Consultant Neurologist and Reader, Kings College Hospital NHS Foundation Trust

Lina Nashef co-authored the Oxford Specialist Handbook on epilepsy and has co-edited a textbook on Neurology and Pregnancy. Her research field included mortality and sudden death in epilepsy. She was previously a trustee of Epilepsy Research UK and has served as a council member of the Association of British Neurologists.

	There is insufficient evidence to inform everyday decisions in clinical practice about whether to treat cavernoma with or without surgery. This can leave doctors and patients uncertain about whether to use surgery. Answering this uncertainty is the top priority for research into cavernoma and the subject of the pilot CARE Study which has just started recruiting patients.
